

Laboratory sample courier service EOI – Carrapateena

Overview

Carrapateena is a copper-gold project located approximately 160km north of Port Augusta in South Australia. The project is located on Pernatty Station with supporting infrastructure located on Oakden Hills Station. The Kokatha people are the traditional owners of the land.

Construction of Carrapateena is underway and scheduled to be complete by Q4 2019.

Scope

The scope of the laboratory courier is to support the onsite processing team in the timely delivery of laboratory samples to our preferred supplier in the Upper Spence Gulf region. The small courier service for Carrapateena is as follows:

With a base at either Port Augusta or Whyalla you will provide a daily service between Carrapateena and the Upper Spencer Gulf centres of Port Augusta and Whyalla. This service will operate on a continual basis of one circuit per day on a 365 day a year service. A suitable vehicle will need to be sourced to service the demand as well as licensed drivers. Vehicles will need to be supplied as mine specified including radio communication.

Anticipated volumes produced from the mill which will need to be transported are:

- 6-8 x 20L buckets every 24hr period – subject to variation.

Anticipated volumes produced from the mine which will need to be transported are:

- Approximately 40 sample bags @ 2.5kg each, every 2 days – subject to variation. Bags will be loaded into a kibble (small purpose-built crate) - a kibble can hold 80 bags.

Initially you will transport the material along the Southern Access Road (SAR) and will transition to the Western Access Road (WAR) at the completion of the WAR.

It will be the responsibility of the driver to load and unload at each site and the driver will be required to carry a valid forklift licence.

Whilst this service will be dedicated to transporting laboratory samples there may be requirements from time to time to transport general freight to and from Carrapateena from the Upper Spencer Gulf region. General freight will be delivered to your nominated depot points. Laboratory samples will always remain the primary service and general freight will be secondary should the need arise.

Typical daily duties:

1. Depart Port Augusta or Whyalla AM for Carrapateena site.
2. Travel along SAR, commencing at opening time of (officially sunrise).
3. Arrival at site and attend site loading point at NPI (Non-Processing Infrastructure) area.
4. Drop off any materials transported and load samples and general freight.
5. Leave Carrapateena site and transfer to Whyalla via Port Augusta. Stop for unloading at Port Augusta only if carrying HIGH PRIORITY general freight (marked as such).
6. Proceed to drop off point in Whyalla and be unloaded.
7. Pick up any freight required and return to Port Augusta to drop off any lower priority deliveries.
8. Material to be stored in a secure location.

KPI's to be agreed at time of negotiation.
