

<p>Project Overview:</p>	<p>Perdaman Chemicals and Fertilisers are focused on the development of the world's largest stream urea plant with a production capacity of 2 MTPA. The plant is located within the Burrup Strategic Industrial Area, Burrup Peninsula, approximately 10km from Dampier and 20km north-west of Karratha on the north west coastline of Western Australia. The development will utilise local natural gas for fertiliser production, using innovative and low-emissions technologies and will be Australia's first Urea Export Project generating Export Revenue of US\$ 800 Million/year. The facility will consist of a Syngas Production Block, Fertiliser Production Block and Offsite Facilities and Utilities.</p>

<p>Scope:</p>	<p>An eyewash station is a unit for washing chemicals or substances that might splash into an individual's eyes before he or she can seek further medical attention. The user needs to wash their eyes for at least 15 minutes.</p> <p>Hence, Emergency eyewash stations are a necessary backup to minimize the effects of accident exposure to chemicals and provide on-the-spot decontamination.</p> <p>They allow workers to flush away hazardous substances that can cause injury and serve the purpose of reducing workplace injury</p> <p>Eyewash station shall be designed in accordance with the guidelines of ANSI Z358.1-2004, Vendor should ensure that a controlled flow of potable water is provided to both eyes simultaneously at a velocity low enough not to injure the user.</p> <p>Vendor shall be responsible of the design , construction and fabrication of the eyewash station in compliance with the standard and shall be suitable for the process conditions as specified in the project design basis and applicable datasheets,</p> <p>Vendor shall guarantee the performance of the eyewash Station and take full responsibility for safe and trouble free operations</p>
