Waste Water Treatment Plant

<p>ICN hereby invites Registration of Interest from respective trade contractors and suppliers for the Southern Queensland Correctional Precinct Stage 2 project for the Waste Water Treatment Plant package. All ROI submissions should be made through the ICN Gateway.</p>	
<p>Scope of Works</p>	<p>A new wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) is required as part of the South Queensland Correctional Precinct (SQCP) (Gatton) Stage 2 expansion. The new WWTP will replace the existing WWTP (which does not have capacity to handle the future flows) and will treat raw wastewater from the prison to enable recycled water reuse. The new WWTP will consist of an inlet works (coarse and fine screens and fats, oils and grease removal), membrane bioreactor, disinfection system, WAS handling and dewatering system, blowers, chemical dosing systems, electrical and control systems, buildings (for the electrical switchroom, dewatering system and blowers) and other associated infrastructure required for the safe and reliable operation of the plant. The Average Dry Weather Flow (ADWF) to the WWTP is estimated to be 0.5 ML/d and the plant capacity on a load basis is approximately 4,000 EP. Recycled water end uses may include toilet flushing, laundry applications, cooling towers, firewater, and irrigation.</p>
<p>Project Summary</p>	<p>In June 2019 Queensland Government announced plans to build a new 1000 bed men’s prison near Gatton with the \$653M facility planned for completion in 2023. The Stage 2 expansion will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Address overcrowding across the correctional system in Queensland. • Improve safety of correctional officers and prisoners. • Deliver economic boost and additional jobs during both construction and operation. <p>The Queensland Government has determined that this new correctional centre will adopt a ‘health and rehabilitation’ operating model which will support safer communities through enhanced mental health and drug and alcohol rehabilitation services for prisoners, with a focus on addressing the ice epidemic and its link to violent and property crime.</p>
<p>Location of Works</p>	<p>The Southern Queensland Correctional Precinct is located at Grindle Road, Spring Creek, about 12 km north-east of Gatton and about 100 km south west of Brisbane in the Lockyer Valley</p>
<p>Delivery Schedule</p>	<p>Design Development is currently in progress and is anticipated to be complete by Early December 2020. Subcontractor and supplier procurement will commence in September 2020.</p> <p>Early Site works are planned to commence in December 2020. Main works are planned for commencement in January 2021.</p>
