

## Happy New Year! Work underway on NGP for 2018

The NGP Team would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a Happy New Year and wish you all the best for 2018.

After a short break, Jemena is excited to be back to progress the development of the Northern Gas Pipeline (NGP). It will be a busy and exciting year for the NGP Team as we continue to safely build and, in the second half of the year, commission and have first gas flow through the new pipeline.

Right now work is continuing at the Phillip Creek Compressor Station (PCCS). At Mount Isa Compressor Station (MICS), Valmec has returned

to commence landing major equipment onto foundations, and structural and piping work. The team at Spiecapag, the QLD Pipeline construction company, is back as it continues to test and prepare to commission this section of pipeline. McConnell Dowell will begin construction on the remaining 219km NT/QLD section of pipeline soon. In 2017 the team achieved a lot: we secured all necessary government, environmental & landholder approvals; safely delivered 622km of line pipe; constructed 403km of pipeline – 262km in NT, 141km in QLD – ahead of schedule; and began construction of

our compressor stations.

We also delivered the Tennant Creek Social Employment Project, and provided Project Ready Training to 59 local people, offering jobs to graduates. Those achievements required considerable dedication, commitment and effort from the local community and we thank you for that. We will draw on your skills and experience this year as we look to achieve our commitments, including to progress and finalise the construction of pipeline, MICS and PCCS. We also look forward to further developing our relationships within the local communities.

## Phillip Creek Compressor Station taking shape

A transformation is taking place at Jemena's Phillip Creek Compressor Station, with buildings and structures now the predominant feature.

Contractor Civec has moved from civil to structural, mechanical, piping, electrical and instrumentation works. Large cranes are on site to conduct heavy lifts, with some structures now more standing at more 30 metres high. Work began on the site north west of Tennant Creek in May

last year, with local contractors undertaking earthworks and the majority of the site development.

About 190 people are working on PCCS, the majority of whom are living on site.

The compressor station will clean and dry the gas before pressurising it and pushing it down the pipeline. Construction will continue into the second half of this year, following which commissioning and operation will occur.
